

'Hawks Hat



Celebrate the Superbowl Champs with this fun Fair Isle hat!

Gauge

4.5 stitches/6 rows per inch on US #7 needles

Size

Adult Medium

Needle Size:

US #7 16" circular

Yarn

Cascade 220 Superwash (100% merino superwash wool, light worsted weight, 220 yards per skein)

1 skein each:

MC: 813 Blue Velvet

CC1: 851 Lime

CC2: 871 White

NOTE: You'll have enough yarn to knit at least 2 hats (switching the colors around may yield a third hat!)

Notions:

Stitch marker, needle for weaving in ends

Cast On:

With MC, cast on 92 sts. Place marker, join to work in the round.

Round 1: Corrugated Ribbing: *K2 MC, p2 CC. Repeat from * to end of the round.

Repeat Round 1 until piece measures 1" or desired length from the cast-on edge

Body

Work Chart rounds 1-33, **increasing 4 sts evenly on 1st round (96 sts.)**

Hat should measure 6.5" from the cast-on edge.

Crown

Continuing in MC, shape crown as described below changing to double pointed needles as needed.

Round 1: *Work 6, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [84 sts remain]

Round 2: Work even

Round 3: *Work 5, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [72 sts remain]
Round 4: Work even
Round 5: *Work 4, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [60 sts remain]
Round 6: Work even
Round 7: *Work 3, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [48 sts remain]
Round 8: Work even
Round 9: *Work 2, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [36 sts remain]
Round 10: Work even
Round 11: *Work 1, k2tog. Repeat from * around. [24 sts remain]
Round 12: Work even
Round 13: *K2tog. Repeat from * around. [12 sts remain]

Finishing

Cut yarn, leaving a generous tail. Draw tail through remaining stitches on the needle. Pull gently to close hole. Weave in tail.
Weave in ends.
